Q: Are dual language programs effective instructional models?

A: Absolutely! Long-term studies show that dual programs have a high success rate in attaining academic proficiency for all students. On standardized academic exams, we start to see students outperform monolingual students beginning in middle school and beyond. (Collier and Thomas).

Q: When will my student become bilingual?

A: Dual language programs are long-term To achieve the benefits of this program, families need to commit to the program K-12. Currently, the program is K-8. The high school is developing a dual model.

Q: What are the criteria for students to enter the program?

A: There is no specific criteria to enter the program. The program needs a balance of students from each program language. Priority is given to students who have siblings in the program. The next consideration goes to MVSD students and then to students who live outside the district.

Q: How do families apply?

What is Madison's dual language program?

- Two-way program that combines students from two different languages for instruction in both languages.
- 50:50 model: Each day 50% of instruction is in Spanish and 50% is in English
- Approximately 50% of the students are Native/Bilingual Spanish speakers and the other 50% are Native/Bilingual English speakers
- Generally, non-bilingual English dominant speakers do not enter in grades 3-5
- Spanish, bilingual and English speakers are instructed together in all subjects
- Team teachers; students have two teachers
- No translating
- Students are taught how to use one language to learn the other
